- A completed application form proposed by the student and approved by the Faculty Lead.
- A written proposal that explains the student's goals, rationale proposed curriculum.
- A Major Academic Plan (MAP) made with an Academic Advisor.
- Signature of the Faculty Lead verifying that the proposed curriculum will meet the goals and needs of the student.
- A minimum of 15 semester hours in residence at BYU-Hawaii.
- A capstone experience proposal epitomizing the degree proposal. (Students may not register until degree proposal is approved.)

Section 1: Primary Courses (28 Credits) This section is composed of a minimum of 28 credits (not necessarily all upper division) drawn from approved minors, certificates, and clusters which support the student's proposed focus of study.
